**CORONAVIRUS:** The Bishops Conference of England and Wales have offered guidelines for to be followed as precautionary measures during the current state of alert for the coronavirus. There is no cause for alarm but sensible precautions are advised. Full details are published on the Parish Website, our Facebook Page and are available on a printout available at the back of the church. Please note the instructions followed in this parish are those stipulated by the Bishop of East Anglia. Other diocese, possibly with higher population density, may have slightly different practice which you are asked to observe if you are visiting. To avoid any confusion please follow the regulations of the diocese you are visiting and do not compare and contrast, the Bishops are following the medical advice appropriate to their own region.

Please keep an eye on the Parish Website and Facebook Page for Updates. If we go to level 3 the Bishop will decide what arrangements are to be made for Masses. Weekday Masses are unlikely to be affected because the numbers are usually under 30 but it may be necessary to find suitable outdoor facilities for congregations of over 100. A large garden or possibly the Rosmini Centre Car Park. I stress this is just a contingency plan at present and any offers of a suitable outdoor location, garden/field/paddock, for an outdoor Mass would be welcome.

**GOOD FRIDAY PROCESSION OF WITNESS** This year's procession of witness through the town will commence at Our Lady and St Charles Borromeo at 10 am. It is hoped that the First Holy Communion children and the confirmation candidates will be able to play a part in the opening liturgy and then we shall walk into town via Tillery Park, the Clarkson Memorial and finishing in the market Square.

**LENTEN OBSERVANCES.** Lent is a time that has long accrued odd customs and traditions that are not and never have been a proper part of the Lenten observance. One such 'Tradition' is the covering of statues. Though widely practiced this is a practise that was never properly adopted by the church and was actually abrogated with the publication of the General Instruction on the Roman Missal in 1969. It is however a custom which persists and may be permitted. With that in mind in this parish the Crosses will be covered on Palm Sunday and the statues will be veiled during Holy Week, The Altar will be stripped on Holy Thursday after the Mass of the Lords Supper. Crosses are unveiled after the ritual on Good Friday but the statues will remain veiled until the Easter Vigil when they will be unveiled during the singing of the Gloria. The altar will be redressed during the offertory at the Easter Vigil.

Lent Ends with the beginning of the Easter Triduum on Holy Thursday with the Mass of the Lords Supper, (Please note that because of the Corona Virus there will be no Mandatum this year) after the mass there will be a period of watching before the altar of repose, a rota for watchers will be made available shortly for volunteers to fill in. At 10 pm the watch will end with Night Prayer. The full Holy Week timetable will be available as of the 4th Sunday of Lent,
